CCC OFFICIALS CERTIFICATION PROGRAM

This program consists of five steps from entry level to international level. It includes course conductor training, technical delegate training and event management as well as technical training.

Level 1

This is a 10 hour course that provides an overview of what a cross-country ski competition is all about. The focus is on the duties of minor officials for both Olympic Style ((individual start, mass start, pursuit start, relay start and sprints) and Loppet Style (mass participation) competitions. Course fee: \$55.00

Level 2

competition committee for club, provincial and national competitions including the BC Cup Series, BC Winter Games and loppets. The course covers all official race formats, rules and regulations, rule interpretation, electronic timing, all aspects of the results system, and volunteer management. Course fee: \$70.00

Level 3

This is a 3.5 day course. It is designed to prepare an official to: (1) effectively structure, staff and manage a Competition Committee at Provincial through National level competitions, (2) perform any 'major official role at the National Championship level, (3) perform the role of a provincial Technical Delegate, and (4) have a good understanding of CCC/FIS rules.

Please note the requirements for participation in Officials Certification Courses - levels 1 & 2. Course pre-requisites will be strictly enforced. For more information about course pre-requisites visit the CCBC website at:

ZONE4 CLINICS

ZONE4 is Cross Country BC's official race management software. All nationally and provincially sanctioned competitions held in BC - BC Cup Series, BC Sprint Championships, Nor Ams / Continental Cups and National Championships - produce standardized results through the use of this program.

ZONE4 Clinic - Introduction:

This clinic provides a general overview of Zone4 and prepare participants to use it for running club races, regional cup races and similar types of events. Topics will include the tasks of the competition secretary and timekeeping departments as they relate to ZONE4, online registration, posting results, etc.

ZONE4 Clinic - Advanced:

Preparing a start list for the different race formats (interval, individual sprint, team sprint, traditional relay, pursuit and mass start); doing a draw; producing results and interfacing the software program with CCBC electronic timing equipment (Chronomix – Compusport 737) will all be covered during this clinic. Prerequisite: ZONE4 Clinic - Introduction.

AUDITORS' REPORT

To the Directors of Cross Country BC

We have audited the statement of financial position of Cross Country BC as at March 31, 2010 and the statements of financial activity, changes in net assets and cash flows for the year then ended. These financial statements are the responsibility of the Association's management. Our responsibility is to express an opinion on these financial statements based on our audit.

Except as explained in the following paragraph, we conducted our audit in accordance with Canadian generally accepted auditing standards. Those standards require that we plan and perform an audit to obtain reasonable assurance whether the financial statements are free of material misstatement. An audit includes examining, on a test basis, evidence supporting the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements. An audit also includes assessing the accounting principles used and significant estimates made by management, as well as evaluating the overall financial statement presentation.

Since this is our initial appointment as auditors of the Association, we were not present at the physical inventory taking at the beginning of the fiscal year. Furthermore, the previous auditors were unable to express an opinion on the financial statements for the year ended March 31, 2009 because they did not observe the physical inventory taking at March 31, 2009 nor at March 31, 2008 and their examination also identified deficiencies in internal control over inventory. We have not been able to satisfy ourselves through other auditing procedures as to the inventory quantities at March 31, 2009. Accordingly, we were unable to determine whether adjustments to excess of revenues over expenses for the year and opening net assets might be necessary.

In our opinion, except for the effect of adjustments, if any, which might have been determined to be necessary had we been able to observe the physical inventory taking at the beginning of the fiscal year as described in the preceding paragraph, these financial statements present fairly, in all material respects, the results of operations and cash flows of the Association for the year ended March 31, 2010 in accordance with Canadian generally accepted accounting principles. Further, in our opinion, the statement of financial position presents fairly, in all material respects, the financial position of the Association as at March 31, 2010 in accordance with Canadian generally accepted accounting principles.

The comparative figures for March 31, 2009 were reported on by another firm of chartered accountants. They were unable to express an opinion on the financial statements because of the inventory matter as described in the second preceding paragraph.

Notes to Financial Statements

Year ended March 31, 2010

Cross Country BC (the "Association") is a not-for-profit organization incorporated under the Societies Act of British Columbia and accordingly is exempt from income tax under provisions of the Income Tax Act provided certain requirements of the Income Tax Act are met. It is not a registered charity that can issue tax receipts. Its purpose is to provide provincial programming for the continuous development of cross-country skiing programs, recreational through to competitive, to a broad cross section of the community.

1. Significant accounting policies:

(a) Basis of presentation:

These financial statements have been prepared by management in accordance with Canadian generally accepted accounting principles for non-profit organizations as defined in the Canadian Institute of Chartered Accountants Handbook.

(b) Inventory:

Supplies inventories are measured at the lower of cost and net realizable value. The Association uses the same cost formula for all the inventories having a similar nature and use to the Association. When circumstances which previously caused inventories to be written-down no longer exist the previous impairment is reversed.

(c) Capital assets:

Purchased capital assets are recorded at cost. Contributed capital assets are recorded at fair value at the date of contribution. In instances where fair value (estimated market /appraisal value) cannot be reasonably determined the capital assets are recorded at nominal value. The cost of a capital asset includes the purchase price and other acquisition costs such as freight charges, transportation, insurance costs and duties. In instances where capital assets are acquired at substantially below fair value, the excess of the fair value over the contribution paid will be recorded as contribution. If a portion of the acquired capital asset is not intended for use, its cost and any costs of disposal, net of any estimated proceeds, are attributed to that portion of the acquired capital asset which is intended for use.

Repairs and maintenance costs are charged to expense. Betterments which extend the estimated life of an asset and enhance the service potential of capital assets are capitalized.

When a capital asset no longer contributes to the Association's ability to provide services, its carrying amount is written-down to its residual value with no reversals of such write downs in subsequent periods.

(d) Revenue recognition:

The Association follows the deferral method of accounting for contributions which include donations and government grants.

Contributions that are unrestricted are recorded as revenue when received or receivable if the amount to be received can be reasonably estimated and collection is reasonably assured. Government Grants approved but not received at the end of an accounting period are accrued.

Revenues from memberships and events are recognized when the services are provided or the goods are sold.

(e) Contributed services:

A substantial number of volunteers contribute a significant amount of their time each year to the Association. Due to the difficult nature in determining a fair value for these services, they are not recognized in the financial statements.

(f) Use of estimates:

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with Canadian generally accepted accounting principles requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the dates of the financial statements and the reported amounts of revenues and expenses during the year. Significant items subject to such estimates and assumptions include the carrying amount of capital assets, valuation allowances for receivables and inventories. Actual results could differ from those estimates. These estimates are reviewed periodically, and as adjustments become necessary, they are reported in earnings in the year in which they become known.

1. Significant accounting policies (continued):

(g) Financial instruments:

All financial instruments, are initially recorded at fair value. Subsequent measurement and changes in fair value will depend on their initial classification, as follows: held-for-trading financial assets are measured at fair value and changes in fair value are recognized in the Statement of Financial Activity; available-for-sale financial instruments are measured at fair value with changes in fair value recorded in the Statement of Net Assets until the investment is derecognized or impaired at which time the amounts would be recorded in the Statement of Financial Activity. Loans and receivables, held to maturity investments and other financial liabilities are measured at amortized cost.

The Association classified financial instruments as follows:

- (a) Designated cash as held-for trading.
- (b) Designated accounts receivable as loans and receivables.
- (c) Designated accounts payable and accrued liabilities as other financial liabilities.

The Association also complies with CICA 3861, "Financial Instruments - Disclosure and Presentation", for the presentation and disclosure of financial instruments.

(h) Accounting pronouncements issued and effective for the current fiscal year:

Effective April 1, 2009, the Association adopted the amendments to CICA Handbook Sections 4400, Financial Statement Presentation by Not-for Profit Organizations and Section 4470, Disclosure of Allocated Expenses by Not-for-Profit Organizations. The amendments removed the requirement to disclose net assets invested in capital assets, clarify capital asset recognition criteria and amortization, and added a requirement for disclosure of allocated fundraising and general support expenses by not-for-profit organizations, and a requirement to follow Handbook Section 1540, Cash Flow Statements. The application of these amendments did not have any impact on the Association's financial statements, except for the inclusion of a statement of cash flows.

Effective April 1, 2009, the Association adopted the amendments in Section 1000, Financial Statement Concepts. The amendments clarify the relationship between incurring expenditures and creating assets and clarifies that items which do not meet the definition of assets or liabilities, are not eligible for recognition. The implementation of the amendments did not have an impact on the financial statements.

1. Significant accounting policies (continued):

(i) Accounting pronouncements issued but not yet effective:

In March 2010, the Accounting Standards Board ("AcSB") released an exposure draft prescribing a new accounting framework for not-for-profit organizations ("NPOs"), such as the Association. The proposed accounting framework will incorporate current CICA Handbook Sections 4400 to 4470 into the ACSB new accounting handbook, which prescribes accounting standards for Canadian private and publicly accountable entities. The exposure draft is open for comment until July 15, 2010 with a final standard to be released in late 2010. The proposed accounting framework would be effective for the Association for its fiscal year commencing January 1, 2012. The Association is in the process of reviewing the impact of these documents on its reporting framework and financial statements.

4. Contingencies:

From time to time the Association is brought forth as defendant in various lawsuits. The Association reviews its exposure to any potential litigation for which it would not be covered by insurance and assesses whether a successful claim against the Association would materially affect the financial statements of the Association. The Association is not aware of any claims brought against it that if not defended successfully would result in a material change to these financial statements.

5. Financial instruments:

(a) Fair value of financial assets and financial liabilities

The carrying value of cash, accounts receivable, and accounts payable and accrued liabilities approximate their fair value due to the relatively short periods to maturity of these items.

(b) Credit risk exposure

The maximum credit risk exposure for all of the Association's current financial assets is the carrying value of those assets.

6. Capital disclosures:

The Association defines its capital to be its net assets, both financial and capital. The Association's objective when managing capital is to safeguard its ability to continue as a going concern so it can continue to provide programming for continuous development of cross-country skiing programs. Annual budgets are developed and monitored to ensure the Association's capital is maintained at an appropriate level. The Association is not subject to any externally imposed capital requirements.

7. Economic dependence:

A significant portion of the Association's revenue is derived from direct and indirect funding from the Province of British Columbia. In 2010 these revenues represented \$305,881 or approximately 42% (2009 - 51%) of total revenue.
