

REPORT: NORDIC RACERS

Adaptive Programming 101: Starting an Adaptive Cross Country Ski Program

It is no secret the Nordic Racers Ski Club strives to be BC's leader for adaptive cross country skiing. We offer a full spectrum of adaptive programs for skiers of all ages and abilities, making us the most active adaptive programs club in the province. The first level is our Skiing is Believing (SIB) program, a series of one-day introductory cross country ski clinics where individuals with physical or sensory disabilities can "try before they buy". Those that enjoy the experience can then move into our ongoing programs, including Junior Skills Development for skiers 8-15, Adaptive Learn to Loppet (AL2L), skill development for skiers 16 and older and our Nordic Racers Adaptive Race Team for those that want to compete. Sounds like a lot, right? Actually, with a relatively small but committed group of individuals, programs like this could (and should!) be offered at all BC cross country ski clubs.

So where to start? First, you need to establish a committee that is willing to plan, organize and implement programs. In a perfect world, your committee would include:

- A chairperson with strong communication/networking skills and familiar with club policies and procedures.
- A secretary with strong administrative skills for staying on top of emails, minutes, grant applications, etc.
- A coach/volunteer coordinator with strong networking and organizational skills.
- A treasurer with a background in budgeting and financial management.

Our Nordic Racers Adaptive Committee consists of these four positions with three additional members who help implement our programs.

Planning is crucial for any cross country ski program, which is why our committee meets every year no later than June to tentatively plan program start and end dates, to create a hit list of coaches we would like to recruit, develop program budgets, etc. We also try to set up the race schedule for our racing team in cooperation with other adaptive coaches at the national, provincial and local level to maximize the number of adaptive athletes attending races in order to provide the best competitive opportunities possible. In that only 14% of Canadians have a disability, there is a much smaller pool of potential athletes to draw from so adaptive coaches should work together to ensure that when their athletes do race, they race with as many other adaptive athletes as possible.

When our adaptive programs first started, we found it challenging to recruit enough volunteers - we often heard, "I'd like to help, but I don't know what to do so I don't think I should volunteer." As a result, we developed our Adaptive Volunteer Education program (AVE), a 5-hour workshop designed to teach the basics of working with adaptive skiers, including how to guide a blind or visually impaired skier, how to select equipment and how to evaluate the accessibility of a ski venue. This workshop is held at the beginning of every season.

Though all of our adaptive program coaches must take this workshop, we don't make it mandatory for our volunteers as they are always under the supervision of a trained and experienced coach. The first year we offered our AVE program, eight volunteers attended. This past season that number doubled to 16 and our volunteer return rate is over 90%, a clear indicator that once people understand how to effectively work with adaptive skiers, they truly do enjoy the experience.

At about the same time we offer our AVE program, our Nordic Racers Adaptive Racing Team shifts from dryland to on snow training. This past season, they trained as a team twice a week with additional workouts on their own. Our adaptive racing team is run just like it any able-bodied team - the only difference is that some of the techniques are disability-specific, such as teaching an arm amputee athlete how to maximize momentum with just one pole or improving communication between a skier who is blind and their guide. Just like an able-bodied athlete, each of our racing team athletes had their own training program designed to help them improve and it paid off - more than a few medals were won at the 2013 Ski Nationals by our adaptive racing team members!

The next program to start is SIB and we typically host three workshops per season starting in January. This program is by far our largest and most effective recruiting tool for our ongoing programs as participants get an opportunity to try the sport without having to make a long-term commitment. These clinics have a simple concept - each adaptive skier is encouraged to come with a friend or family member so that we can teach both of them how to ski. We also teach the friend/family member how they can help the adaptive skier both on and off the snow.

A key objective of SIB is to demonstrate cross country skiing can be accessible to people with disabilities. Many adaptive athletes cannot get out to ski if they don't have a friend or family member willing to go with them to help with transportation, moving gear, guiding, etc. so we want to bridge this gap by encouraging each adaptive skier to bring along a friend or family member. We believe that if both the adaptive skier and their friend/family member enjoy skiing, they are more likely to continue skiing because it becomes something they can do together. Would you enjoy skiing if the only person you ever skied with was yourself?

We start SIB off by dividing participants into three groups: standing skiers, sit skiers and friends/family members. Each adaptive skier is paired up with a volunteer and then each group is led through a 90-minute basic ski skills lesson with a certified coach. Everyone then meets back in the lodge for a 45 minute lunch break before getting back out on snow, but this time, the friends/family members are reunited with their respective adaptive skier and his/her volunteer from the morning session. Athletes of similar speed are grouped together to go for a ski under the leadership of a coach and/or a trained volunteer.

Over the past three years, we have streamlined SIB logistics such as registration and transportation, making it possible for just one or two people to organize these clinics and about four to actually run them. What has also made these workshops so successful is the great corporate support we've had from Sigge's Sport Villa (discounted rates for rentals and bus transportation) and Whistler Olympic Park (complimentary passes for one support person for every adaptive athlete) as well as financial support through the Canadian Paralympic Committee's Recruitment Grant.

The AL2L starts in January, and mirrors the NR loppet training program for its adult members. The AL2L tends to draw older adaptive skiers who don't want to compete seriously, but want to improve their skills and fitness, and get out to do some local loppets.

Our Junior Skills Development program also starts in early January and runs for about eight weeks. Led by a certified coach with adaptive experience, this program is unique

because it is a fully integrated program - skiers with disabilities participate alongside their able-bodied peers. This past season, we had two boys who are visually impaired take part and the feedback was all of the skiers absolutely loved it! It was especially significant to the two skiers who were visually impaired because it helped not only boost their physical motor skills, but their self-confidence too.

As an example, each of the young skiers takes a turn leading warm up. The day one of the boys who is visually impaired got to lead, he was practically bursting out of his jacket with pride! When his dad arrived to pick him up, the first thing he said was, "Dad! I got to lead today! I *never* get to lead!" Why is this significant? Because children with disabilities typically have fewer sport programs available to them. When they do participate, they are often not given the chance to be a leader simply because they are the only one with a disability in amongst able-bodied children. With a few tweaks in how he organized lessons, our Junior Skills Development coach made it possible for our two skiers who are visually impaired to be on equal footing with their sighted peers something they are constantly struggling to achieve in their daily lives.

The second example involved the other visually impaired boy who said, "Dad, I don't want you to go. I want to go alone with my friends" when the father offered to go along for the program's finale event - a day trip to Whistler Olympic Park.

Why is this significant? Because parents of children with disabilities often take a more active role in their children's lives - for example, parents of blind or visually impaired children often guide their children in sports activities whereas able-bodied children are let loose on their own. It was incredibly rewarding to hear a young boy who is visually impaired felt comfortable enough to go someplace unfamiliar with his ski group without help from his parents. He saw himself as just a member of a group of friends going for a day of skiing - his lack of vision was irrelevant.

Hopefully some of you reading this will realize adaptive programs are feasible for all clubs and that in every community, there are people with disabilities who will enjoy skiing just as much as you do, but just need the opportunity. The Nordic Racers Ski Club would be happy to help any clubs start an adaptive program by providing on-site expertise, training manuals, logistics support or answering any questions about adaptive programming. REPORT: NICKEL PLATE CROSS COUNTRY SKI CLUB

Who are the Nickel Plate Junior Racers?

Just 45 minutes from Penticton in BC's Okanagan Valley, Nickel Plate Nordic Centre is a cross-country skiing paradise. Located at 6000 feet elevation, boasting 65 kilometres of groomed trails, and a ski season starting in November and finishing in late March, the conditions are ideal for the development of young skiers. The Nickel Plate Junior Racers is a recently developed cross-country ski program which has experienced growth in team members during the 2012-13 ski season. Over the past two years, the Nickel Plate Junior Racers program has grown from a small group of youth to a larger number of committed young skiers ages 9-16. Upon completion of Jackrabbits, these young skiers are benefitting from a program which offers a high level of quality coaching, a sense of team camaraderie, and the competitive experience. Improvement in skiing technique, endurance, race performance, and most of all, team building and fun, are the hallmarks of this program.

Coaching

Team coaching is led by Jerome Jang, a fully accredited Level 3 National Coaching Certification Program (NCCP) of Canada Cross country ski coach. Jerome has also completed level 4 coaching tasks. Jerome's experience in cross country ski coaching extends beyond the club to the provincial, national and international level. As a NCCP facilitator, he conducts Introduction to Community Coaching, Community Coaching, Competition Coaching Learning to Train dryland and on snow workshops for Cross Country Canada. In that capacity, which he has filled for the past 20 years, he has mentored, interacted and observed many ski coaches throughout B.C. As a founding and executive member of the Nickel Plate Nordic Ski Club, Jerome designed and located a number of the original ski trails and oversaw the original ski program during the formative years of the club as a parent, coach, and organizer. Jerome's coaching philosophy is: "A focus on great technique, good training, good race support, and

developing good habits for training and racing will bring good results. All of this while having fun!"

Supplementing Jerome's coaching throughout the season are level 2 coach Frank Perrier of Nickel Plate Nordic and Peach City Runners and Adventure Sports, along with several parent volunteers who hold level 1 coaching certification.

The 2012-13 Ski Season

The team started off the ski season in late August with several fun and challenging hikes in the Okanagan region including Penticton, Apex Mountain, Summerland, and Peachland. Dryland training sessions commenced in the fall, focusing on fitness, coordination and flexibility sessions designed to prepare the kids for the cross-country skiing season. Activities included roller skiing, ski bounding with poles, hikes, cross-country running, and indoor gym sessions.

A weekend fall training camp at Nickel Plate allowed for team-building activities, goal-setting for the upcoming ski season, and fitness activities such as mountain biking, running, hiking and stretching. The first day on snow was in mid-November. Training focused on refining both classic and skate ski technique, and developing fitness and stamina. Additional focus was placed on specific race-day strategies. Very importantly, fun ski days were incorporated into training days.

The Junior Racers and their parents introduced themselves to the community in early December, participating in the Downtown Penticton Santa Claus Parade. On January 19th, the Junior Racers participated in a fundraising "Ski-a-Thon" to raise funds for waxing supplies, tools, a team waxing tent, and other expenses associated with racing and training. In addition to the exceptional fundraising efforts by the team, the Junior Racers surpassed personal goals for Ski-a-Thon time and distances. Our top skier, Noah Beglaw, skied an outstanding 9 laps of a 3 km loop within 2 hours! Both developmental and competitive skiers worked extremely hard during this event, supported by a fantastic group of parent volunteers and Coach Jerome. Many sponsors and individuals donated to the

Ski-a-Thon. These efforts, combined with further fundraising through sales of local coffee, have provided a solid foundation for the Nickel Plate Junior Racers' 2013-14 ski season.

Race report

During the 2012-13 season, the Nickel Plate Junior Racers competed in a number of races including the Teck BC Cup series at Sovereign Lake and Telemark; the Teck Okanagan Cup series at Larch Hills, Overlander Ski Club, and Sovereign Lake; the Nat Read Brown Ranch Family Weekend Races in Princeton; and the Nickel Plate and Apple (Telemark) Loppets. These events have offered opportunities for the Junior Racers to "learn to race" or improve on their race technique.

Looking Ahead!

An end-of-season weekend sleepover at Nickel Plate saw the Junior Racers and Skill Development Jackrabbits participate in snowshoeing, sledding, building snow caves, and powder hound skiing. Together, the Jackrabbits and the Junior Racers participated in the "Racing Rocks" day at Nickel Plate in early March. Excitement is in the air for Nickel Plate and the Junior Racing team, as Penticton prepares to host the 2016 BC Winter Games. The BC Winter Games will offer potential opportunities for cross country skiers born in 2001 and 2002 to participate in elite-level racing. A biathlon facility and biathlon youth program at Nickel Plate are also in the early stages of development. And, stay tuned early on in the ski season for a youth cross-country ski camp prior to the regional November on-snow camp, to be hosted by the Nickel Plate Junior Racers. Coaching will be provided by Jerome Jang, with support from other qualified coaches.





The seven steps/workshops and one PD module now available in the new competency-based NCCP are:

- Introduction to Community Coaching (ICC) Workshop (10 hrs). This program is designed to provide parents and other beginner coaches with basic information and a feeling of confidence as they begin their role as a coach. The orientation is towards skiers of all age groups with an emphasis on working with children under six years of age (Active Start stage of athlete development). Workshops should be held <u>prior</u> to the snow season and can be scheduled anytime between now and next winter.
- Community Coaching (CC) Workshop (16 hrs). This program provides essential training for coaches delivering skill development programs to children six to nine years of age (FUNdamentals stage of

- athlete development). Snow is required so workshops need to be scheduled after the beginning of next winter.
- **Community Coaching AWAD Module** (5 hrs) for coaches of skiers with a disability. Classroom and onsnow sessions held in conjunction with a learn to ski camp.
- Learning to Train (L2T Dryland) Workshop (18.25 hrs). This program is directed at coaches working with children ten to twelve years of age (Learning to Train stage of athlete development). Coaches are taught about developmental age, physical literacy, team building, athletic components (aerobic fitness, speed, etc.), nutrition, how to design their own sport program, adventure-based activities (year-round), roller-skiing and planning a practice. Courses should be held prior to the snow season and can be scheduled anytime between now and next winter.
- Learning to Train (L2T On-snow) Workshop (16 hours). This program is also directed at coaches working with children ten to twelve years of age. It is designed to train coaches on team management, supporting athletes at a competition, teaching and learning, equipment selection, ski preparation and how to effectively teach ski technique. Snow is required, and workshops should be scheduled after the beginning of next winter.
- Training to Train (T2T Dryland) Workshop (17.5 hrs). This program provides essential training for coaches working with junior racing programs, and specifically with athletes 12 to 16 years of age (Training to Train stage of athlete development). Courses should be held **prior** to the snow season and can be scheduled anytime between now and next winter.
- Training to Train (T2T On-snow) Workshop (17 hours). This program is also directed at coaches working with athletes twelve to sixteen years of age. Snow is required, and workshops should be scheduled after the beginning of next winter.
- Learning to Compete (L2C Dryland) Workshop (5 days). This program is directed at coaches working
 with athletes 16 to 20 years of age. Workshops are scheduled by Cross Country Canada approximately
 once per year.

NOTES:

• New coaches must begin their training by taking the Introduction to Community Coach (ICC) Workshop for cross-country skiing! Note that this is a sport-specific workshop, and should not be confused with the generic ICC (theory) courses advertised by the Coaching Association of BC.



CCC OFFICIALS CERTIFICATION PROGRAM

This program consists of five steps from entry level to international level. It includes course conductor training, technical delegate training and event management as well as technical training.

Level 1

This is a 10 hour course that provides an overview of what a cross country ski competition is all about. The focus is on the duties of minor officials for both Olympic Style (individual start, mass start, pursuit start, relay start and sprints) and Loppet Style (mass participation) competitions.

Prerequisite: None.

Course fee for CCBC members: \$60.00 Course fee for non-members: \$75.00

Level 2

This is a 16 hour course that prepares officials for a leadership role on a competition committee for club, provincial and national competitions including the BC Cup Series, BC Winter Games and loppets. The course covers all official race formats, rules and regulations, rule interpretation, electronic timing, all aspects of the results system, and volunteer management.

Prerequisite: Level 1 Officials Course & practical race experience.

Course fee for CCBC members: \$75.00 Course fee for non-members: \$90.00

Level 3

This is a 3.5 day course. It is designed to prepare officials to:

- 1) effectively structure, staff and manage a Competition Committee at provincial through National Level competitions; and
- 2) perform any 'major' officials' role at the National Championship level; and
- 3) perform the role of a provincial Technical Delegate; and
- 4) have a good understanding of CCC/FIS rules.

<u>Prerequisite: Level 2 Officials Course, Provincial recommendation (CCBC) & practical race experience.</u>

ZONE4 CLINICS

ZONE4 is Cross Country BC's official race management software. All nationally and provincially sanctioned competitions held in BC – Regional Cup Series, BC Cup Series, BC Midget Championships, Nor Ams and National Championships - produce standardized results through the use of this program.

ZONE4 Clinic – Introduction (7 hours):

This clinic provides a introduction (basic concepts & management focused) overview of Zone4 and will prepare participants to use it for running club races, regional cup races and similar types of events.

Zone4 - Introduction clinic Objectives:

- preliminary Zone4 website race set-up;
- the tasks of the competition secretary and timekeeping departments as they relate to ZONE4:
- online registration;
- preparing a start list for the different race formats (interval, individual sprint, team sprint,
- traditional relay, pursuit and mass start);
- up to and including doing a draw & producing & posting results, etc.

Prerequisite: Level 1 Officials Course.

Clinic fee for CCBC members: \$65.00 Clinic fee for non-members: \$85.00

ZONE4 Clinic – Advanced (8 hours): ZONE4 Clinic – Advanced (8 hours): This clinic provides an advanced (complex) overview of Zone4 and will prepare an advance official the technical knowledge for running club races, regional cup races, Nor Ams, National Championships and similar types of events.

Zone4 - Advanced clinic Objectives:

- advanced preparation of competition secretary and timekeeping department as they
- relate to ZONE4;
- interfacing the software program with electronic timing equipment;
- troubleshooting: finding and eliminating problems (unanticipated race surprises);
- dealing with deadlines;
- producing & posting results, etc.
